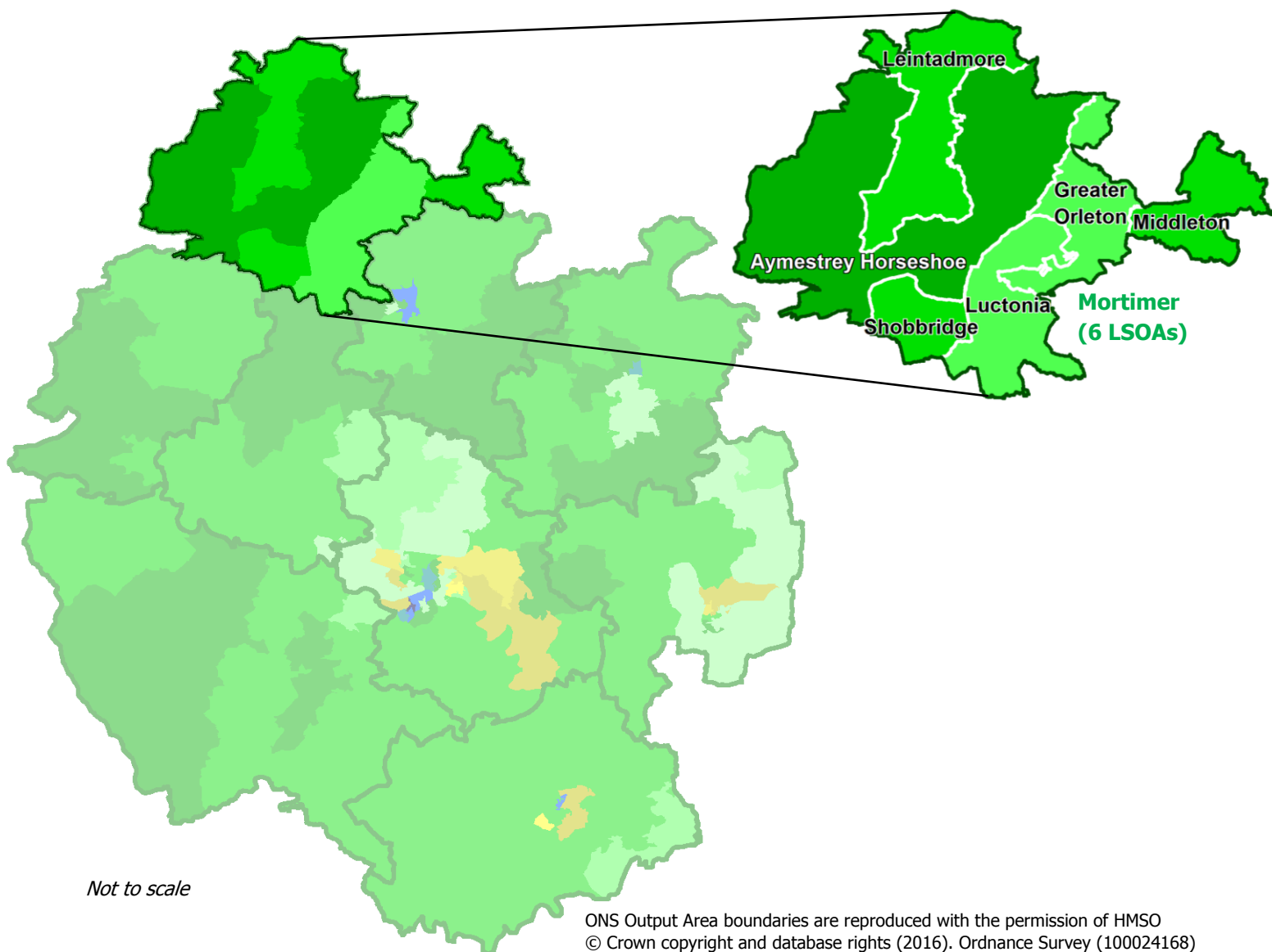


# 2015 Indices of Deprivation for Herefordshire Mortimer locality profile

As with Herefordshire as a whole, the Mortimer locality experiences average levels of overall, multiple deprivation.

The Mortimer locality is very deprived in terms of housing condition, availability of central heating and access to services. It is not affected by any other aspects of deprivation.

'Aymestrey Horseshoe' is the most deprived LSOA in terms of housing condition & availability of central heating.

## Deciles

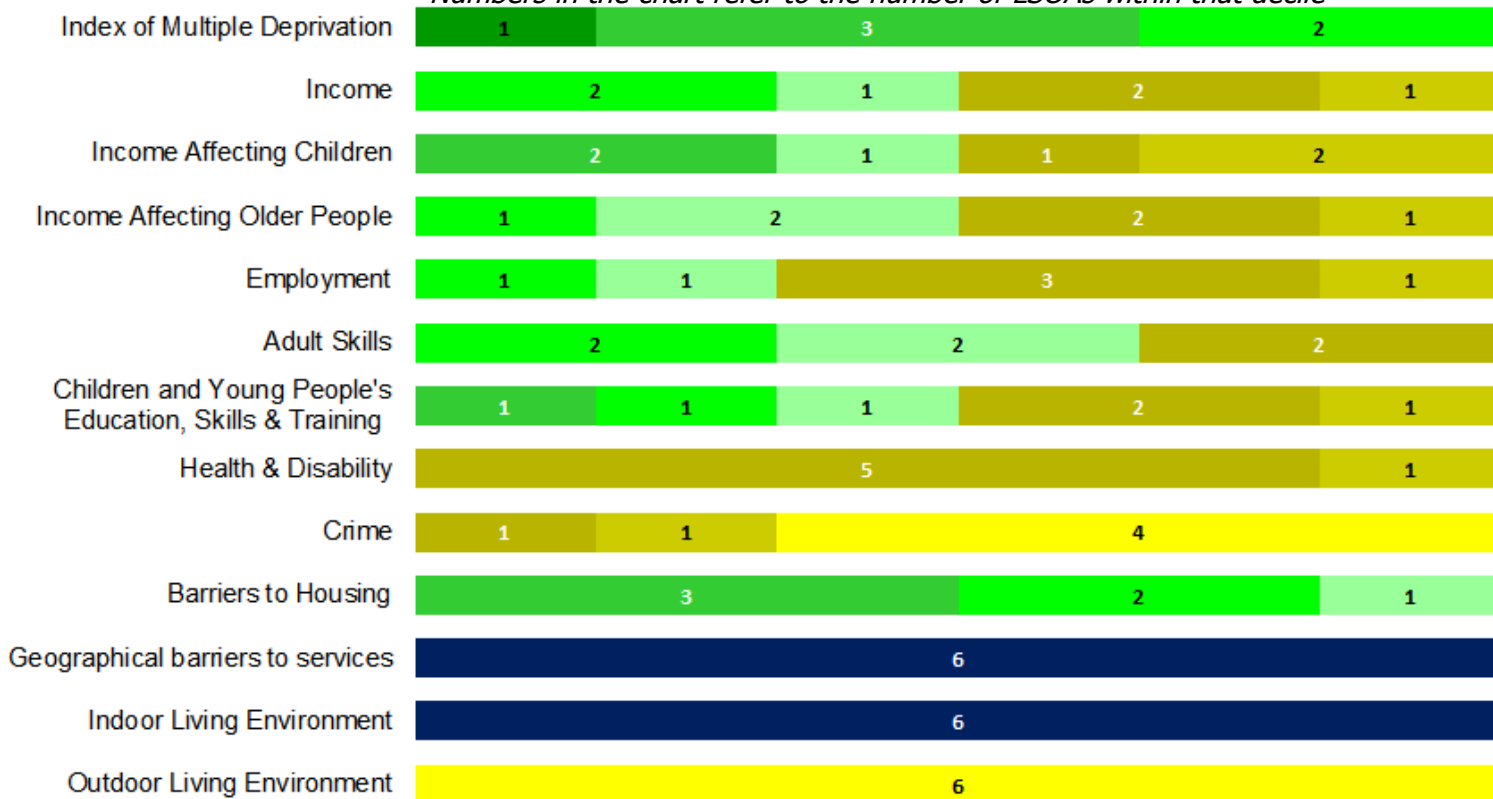


Ranging from the *most* deprived 10 per cent to the *least* deprived 10 per cent of LSOAs in England

*The relative positions of lower super output areas (LSOAs) in the county compared to all others in England; useful if wanting to highlight issues to organisations from outside the county – e.g. to Government or when applying for national funding.*

## Overall Index of Multiple Deprivation (IMD)



As with Herefordshire as a whole, Mortimer experiences average levels of deprivation.

## Income - overall



Eight per cent of people in Mortimer are living in income deprived households, compared to 11 per cent countywide. No areas within the locality are considered as being deprived. 'Greater Orleton' & 'Middleton' are amongst the 20 per cent *least* deprived LSOAs in England.

## Income - children & older people



11 per cent of children and nine per cent of older people in Mortimer live in income deprived households, compared to 14 per cent and 13 per cent countywide. Mortimer has relatively low levels of deprivation for both age groups and no areas are amongst the most deprived in England. 'Luctonia' & 'Greater Orleton' are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived LSOAs in England for income deprived children and 'Greater Orleton' & 'Middleton' are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived for older people.

## Employment



Seven per cent of the Mortimer's working age population are living in employment deprivation, compared to nine per cent countywide. The sub-locality experiences low levels of deprivation and no areas within the locality are considered as being deprived. 'Middleton', 'Aymestrey Horseshoe' & 'Greater Orleton' are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived LSOAs in England.

## Adult skills (qualifications & the ability to speak English)



Mortimer has low levels of deprivation and no areas within the locality are considered as being deprived. 'Greater Orleton' & 'Luctonia' are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived LSOAs in England.

## Children & young people's education & skills (attainment & school attendance)



Mortimer has low levels of deprivation and no areas within the locality are considered as being deprived. 'Aymestrey Horseshoe' & 'Greater Orleton' are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived LSOAs in England.

## Health and Disability



Mortimer has low levels of deprivation and no areas within the locality are considered as being deprived; half of its LSOAs ('Greater Orleton', 'Luctonia' & 'Leintadmore') are amongst the 25 per cent *least* deprived in England.

## Crime (violent crimes, burglaries, thefts and criminal damage)



Mortimer has very low levels of deprivation. Five out of the locality's six LSOAs are amongst the 20 per cent *least* deprived in England, including four which are amongst the 10 per cent least deprived.

## Barriers to housing (affordability, homelessness & overcrowding)



As with the rest of rural Herefordshire, Mortimer experiences average levels of deprivation.

## Geographical barriers to services (distance to schools, GPs, shops, etc)



As is the case for the whole of rural Herefordshire, Mortimer is very deprived, with all six of its LSOAs being amongst the 10 per cent most deprived in England.

## Indoor living environment (house condition & availability of heating)



As with much of Herefordshire, particularly the rural areas, Mortimer is very deprived; all six of its LSOAs are amongst the 10 per cent most deprived in England.

## Outdoor living environment (air quality & road traffic accidents)



As with Herefordshire as a whole, Mortimer has very low levels of deprivation; all six of its LSOAs are amongst the 10 per cent *least* deprived in England.
